## Proud to Receive the Gold AI Quality Mark

We are delighted to share the wonderful news that **Haileybury has been awarded the Gold AI Quality Mark** by the Good Future Foundation. This national accreditation recognises excellence in the thoughtful, responsible and impactful use of AI in schools and we are extremely proud to be among its recipients.



During the assessment process, the Foundation commended Haileybury for our research-driven and forward-thinking strategy. 
It was a wonderful way to celebrate a successful first term in Highfield, full of teamwork, courage and smiles. Here's to many more shared adventures in the new year!
